California's Junk Fax Bill Took Effect on January 1, 2006

The country's toughest ban on unsolicited advertising faxes, SB 833, prohibits the sending of fax advertisements unless the sender has "prior express invitation or permission" from the recipient. Unlike the federal law, there is no "established business relationship" exception.

SB 833 makes it unlawful for any person or organization to send unsolicited fax advertisements if either the sender or recipient is located in California. Consequently, companies in California, as well as those outside of the state wishing to send fax ads to California recipients, must first obtain permission from the recipient; an established business relationship is not enough. Remedies include injunctive relief, actual damages or statuary damages of \$500 and treble damages for willful violations.

The law also requires any person or organization sending any fax communication to include the sender's identifying information, including the date and time the transmission was sent, the person responsible and the telephone number of the sending machine or of the person responsible for sending the message.

The law does NOT apply to faxes sent by tax exempt, non-profit professional or trade associations if 1) the fax is sent in furtherance of the association's tax exempt purpose to a member of the association, 2) the member has provided the fax number, 3) the fax is not primarily for the purpose of advertising goods or services for a third party and 4) the member has not specifically requested that the association stop sending such faxes.
